IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Thank you for all that you have been doing to enable as safe a place as possible for worship, I realise that we have all had to adapt to a different way of working. We are though still the people called Methodists and we seek to continue to be a Christian presence especially with our local communities.

My colleagues and I thought it would be helpful to add some additional advisory notes once most restrictions are lifted on **Monday 19th July**.

Please note these notes are not mandatory but **advisory**.

Advice Notes

Risk Assessments

Risk Assessments will still be required to be undertaken and updated accordingly.

Face coverings in Worship from 19th July

Whilst there are no restricted numbers for worship including weddings, funerals or baptisms it is still advised that face covering should be worn.

This would apply where there are a greater number of people present but especially to some of our smaller places of worship.

A conversation between the local minister and church stewards will need to have taken place and advised say numbers in a smaller place of worship (confined spaces) could be advised to wear face coverings for numbers over 12 people attending.

It is anticipated that some worshippers may wish to continue to wear face coverings, which is absolutely fine.

Social Distancing from 19th July

Whilst there are no social distancing rules, the risks to those deemed vulnerable need to be considered.

We recognise that some people will still feel anxious about being too near people, so we all need to understand that and some may choose to sit further away from people.

Singing from 19th July

Whilst the singing restrictions have been lifted this does not mean that we should all sing with loudness and gusto. Singing is at the heart of Methodism however we also need to consider the possible risks at the moment of spreading infection to others.

Handshaking and Hugging from 19th July

Whilst this may be a natural part of our fellowship together as our greeting each other, it is advised at the moment that we should refrain from this. If we do shake hands then before we leave the premises, we should sanitise our hands.

Cleaning & Hygiene from 19th July

On entering and exiting the building we should encourage the use of hand sanitisers.

All our churches should be safe and clean place to be in with good ventilation.

Sanitising areas that have been used or where people have been sitting or touching light switches etc.

The toilets need to be cleaned thoroughly on a very regular basis.

Holy Communion from 19th July

It is advised that those administering the elements (bread and wine) should get into a habit of sanitising their hands before offering them. Asking people to take their own cup from the communion rack/tray may help to limit the hand-to-hand risks. It is also advisable that we all use a single cup of wine rather than a shared single chalice.

Tea/Coffee after Worship from 19th July

This is allowed to be served after worship; however, we will need to think carefully how this can safely operate. It is advisable that plates of biscuits should not be put out for everyone through risk of people touching them. Rather we adopt new methods as cafes have been doing.

The emphasis will be on all of us to keep each other safe as much as possible the government keeps stressing that it is about 'personal responsibility.'

Dear Friends

We wished to take this opportunity to write to you after the Conference voted on the resolutions contained in the marriage and relationships report.

We very much appreciate that these decisions will stir up many different emotions for our siblings across the Connexion. There will be some who will be deeply hurt and others who will rejoice by what has been decided.

Our Presidential theme this year is God's Table: An Invitation for All, and God's invitation is for every single one of us. The Methodist Church has held tension for many years and as a Church and a family, we must do all we can to live with contradictory convictions.

This work was first reflected on back in 1992 and we have been on this journey together since that point. During the past years we have continued to listen to and to pray for each other and remaining true to what God is saying to us. We must remember in all this, to continue to hold each other in prayer, and to support each other as we find a way forward, respecting our differences.

It is perhaps helpful to remember that there are other issues, some of them discussed at the Conference, on which we hold differing and sometimes strong opinions. We live with them and we do not allow them to impair our communion with each other. We respect each other's consciences, we exercise judgment in when to speak and when to be silent, and we hold one another in prayer. We do all this not for our own sake but for the sake of Christ and the sake of the world which urgently needs to know the power of Christ's reconciling love.

Our prayer for you, beloved siblings, is that in joy or sorrow, in pain or excitement, we might continue to live within that reconciling love.

Same-sex marriages - From Methodist Church House

In deciding in principle that same-sex marriages can be conducted by Methodist ministers and take place in Methodist churches, the Conference has acknowledged that there are two different understandings of marriage held by members of the Church. Some affirm that marriage can be between any two persons, others that marriage can only be between a man and a woman. Our Standing Orders and draft liturgies now reflect both positions.

Behind this decision are decades of study and reflection in which we have been reminded that whilst all Methodists would say that the Bible is authoritative, there are different understandings of what that means.

Those who wrote the report on which the Conference based its decision drew on Biblical scholarship and other sources of theological reflection and recognized that the opinions expressed were deeply and sincerely held and that all are seeking to be faithful to what they understand God to be saying to God's Church. The Conference recognized our ability to live with these sometimes contradictory convictions and voted in the confidence that we could continue to learn from one another.
