I write this message the week after Easter Sunday. This is my favourite time of year, when our minds are focused on new life and Jesus rising from the dead.

I am an avid fan of many Yorkshire farm programmes. 'This week on the farm', 'Springtime on the Farm', 'The Yorkshire Vet' etc. It brings me joy to see the energy and life of the lambs and kids after just a few hours and the cute little baby pigs. It is a reminder of our amazing creator God, who conquered death and received new life.

I wonder as we are slowly released from lockdown and set free into the world again, are you experiencing a sense of new life? I am, there's the excitement of finally being ordained, being able to get out in the garden, meet people again and being back in Church worshipping God.

In John 20:19-31, we see through the experiences of the disciples. So often we need to have proof before we will believe that something is true. We find Thomas needing proof, before he will believe that Jesus is risen. The proof he wants is to see the marks from the nails in Jesus' hands and to physically put his hand in Jesus' side. When he had witnessed both of these signs he was able to say "My Lord & My God".

However, we are unable to see Jesus, to touch him. All we have to go on is what the witnesses of the resurrection tell us in the Bible and what we have experienced of Jesus and are able to share as witnesses in our faith story (testimony). This is where our faith and trust come in as we say the words of the creed and live out our lives as followers of Jesus.

Three times in this passage Jesus says, 'Peace be with you'. Firstly, when Jesus stood among them in the locked room and the disciples were frightened. Secondly, when the disciples realised it was really Jesus and were excited. Thirdly, the second time the disciples were in the locked room, this time with Thomas.

Jesus brought peace to his frightened disciples.

Jesus brought peace to the unbelieving Thomas.

Jesus comes today, to bring us peace.

We go into the world, taking with us peace and spreading the light of Christ.
