Dear Friends,

For my final Circuit pastoral letter I've decided to take one word which I have used in Marriage services during my Ministry to give the living out of our lives as Christians a feel, a purpose, an outworking – the Word is Cherish.

The definition I've got of Cherishing is to Protect or Tend lovingly, To Hold Dear, To Take Care, To Nurture. That's how God cherishes you and me.

In the Marriage service I invite the couple to think about what 'cherishing each other' looks like as they begin their married life together, while also encouraging those in the congregation to think about their relationships and how they cherish those they love and care for.

I wonder what 'Cherishing' looks like in a church context? How wonderfully our congregations would thrive as we cherish each other? As we care for one another lovingly, nurture those we worship alongside, create relationships and friendships with the whole congregation which are deeper than our Sunday morning chats.

For me Cherishing has the most beautiful feel to it. It involves a deep communication, a communion, with one another motivated by love and care, of encouragement and nurturing as together you grow in faith and in your relationship with each other and, essentially, with Jesus as His disciples.

So, the word I leave you with is Cherish, it is Love lived-out. Please do reflect upon it, nourish it, nurture it and allow the North Staffordshire Methodist Circuit to be firmly grounded in the God who is Love. The One Who loves you individually and loves you as His church – the Body of Christ. As you continue to cherish each other you will grow stronger and more able to reach out into the community in which you are set, in which God has placed you, and you will be better able to cherish and disciple those who are drawn into a relationship with Him.

With much love to you all and thank you for your friendship and fellowship over the past six years, May God Bless you as continue to love and Cherish each other and all whom you love.

Godly Play as Bible Study

Story is one of the most ancient forms of knowing. It is the way our Christian heritage has been passed down to us. And story forms the foundation of Godly Play. It invites you to sit as part of a circle and listen as the stories of the Bible are told through word and action. It allows you to immerse yourself in the stories as an act of meditation and prayer and ultimately to encounter God. As the stories are told you sit and listen and at the end of the storytelling you are invited to consider a number of 'I wonder questions'. Questions posed by the storyteller that ask you to reflect on what you have heard. Questions like:

I wonder what part of the story was most important to you? Or

I wonder where you are in the story?


Or

I wonder if there is a part of the story we can leave out and still have all the story we need?

There are no right or wrong answers to any of the questions, they are a means by which you are invited to wonder deeply about the story and what it says to you. Then when the story is put away there is time to respond to all that you have heard and wondered about. It may be that you want to reread the story again for yourself, paint, draw, model or write a response - the choice is entirely yours.

At the end of the response time we gather back together for refreshments before drawing our time together to an end. If this is something you think you might like to try then our next Godly play session will take place on Monday,8"h July at 6.30 pm at Wolstanton Methodist Church. Come and see, wonder, and reflect deeply about stories you thought you knew.

At the Spring synod on Saturday 20th April 2024, I announced that Mr Ian White would be stepping down as Synod Secretary for the Chester & Stoke on Trent District in December 2024. After serving the Methodist church in this capacity for the last 8 years. Ian has decided that it is time to relinquish this role and retire from District leadership. I know that I speak on behalf of you all when I express immense gratitude for all Ian has offered to the district, not just in this role but in a variety of ways.

lan's decision means that we need to appoint a new synod secretary from January 2025, although we would hope that the new secretary could be identified sooner so that they can shadow Ian in preparation for the September Synod.

The role is a volunteer role and open to both lay and ordained people. An outline of what is involved has been included with this letter. Please consider if you, or someone in your congregation, might be called to serve the church in this way. If anyone would like to explore this further, please get in touch with me and I will be happy to have a conversation.

Role Outline

The key information regarding the duties of the Synod Secretary can be found in Standing Order 411 onwards. The list of duties below is an explanation of what this means in practice.

Outline of duties

- Liaise with the Chair, in consultation with the District Leadership Team to plan the programme for the Synod.
- Prepare a working script for the business on the day.
- repare a working script on the business on the day.

 In conjunction with the District Administrator arrange for any ballots on the day eg Election of Representatives to Conference at the September Synod meeting.

 In conjunction with the District Administrator arrange for the appointment of Scrutineers to count votes. Prepare brief notes of the Synod Meeting for circulation.
- Through the Synod letter writer ensure that greetings are sent as requested by Synod
- Present items of Synod business as required
- Submit a brief report of the Synod meeting to the Methodist Recorder

The Synod Secretary is ex officio on a range of District meetings but attendance at the District Leadership Team. District Policy Committee (DPC) (District Trustees' Meeting) and the District Resourcing for Missio Group (DRMG) as grant making body are particularly helpful. The Synod Secretary is a fully participative and

The District Chair will be able to guide which other committee attendance would be most supportive for the Chair and the wider District

3. Synod Directory

The Annual Synod Directory is prepared by the District Administrator, but the Synod Secretary will be consulted on its contents and in liaison with the District Chair will have an initial overview

Synod will determine whether a lay Synod Secretary will have an automatic place at Conference. Irrespective

- of whether the Synod Secretary will attend it is helpful if the Secretary:

 Works with the Chair to arrange a meeting of all representatives shortly before Conference to discuss arrangements, agenda etc.

 Informs the Conference Office of the details of the appointed representatives.
- Keep representatives up to date with information passed from the Conference office. Ensures that representatives register themselves at the appropriate time.
- Provides guidance on procedures to claim expenses

5. Connexional meetings of Synod Secretaries

A supportive and collaborative arrangement has been established with other Synod Secretaries who meet on zoom quarterly to share experiences and raise concerns. The Secretary of Conference or Assistant Secretar of Conference will join these meetings when requested to do so. Good support from some very experienced Synod Secretaries can be found in this group.
